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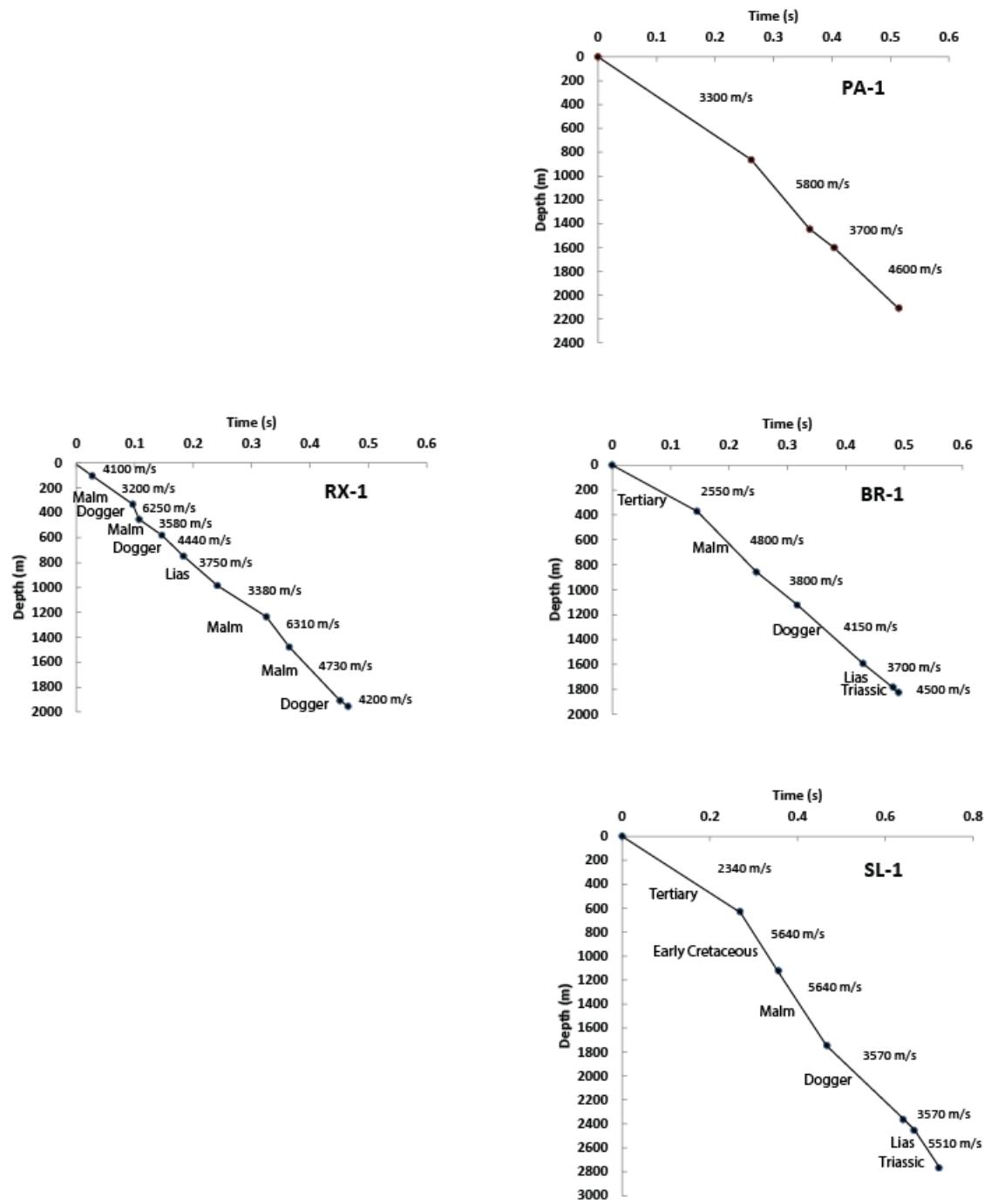


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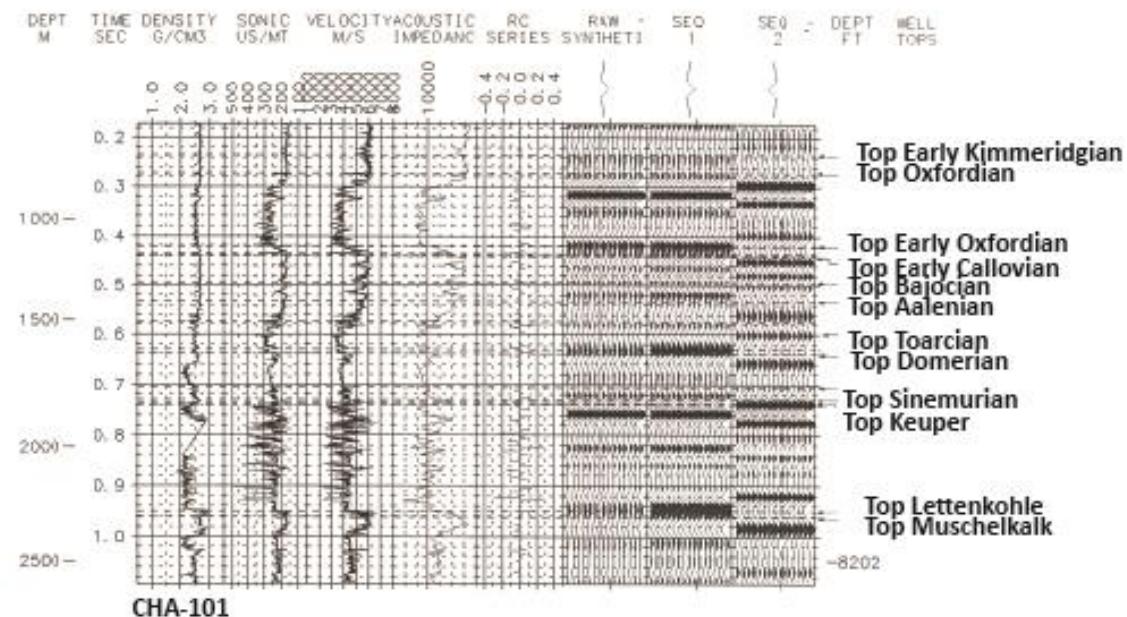
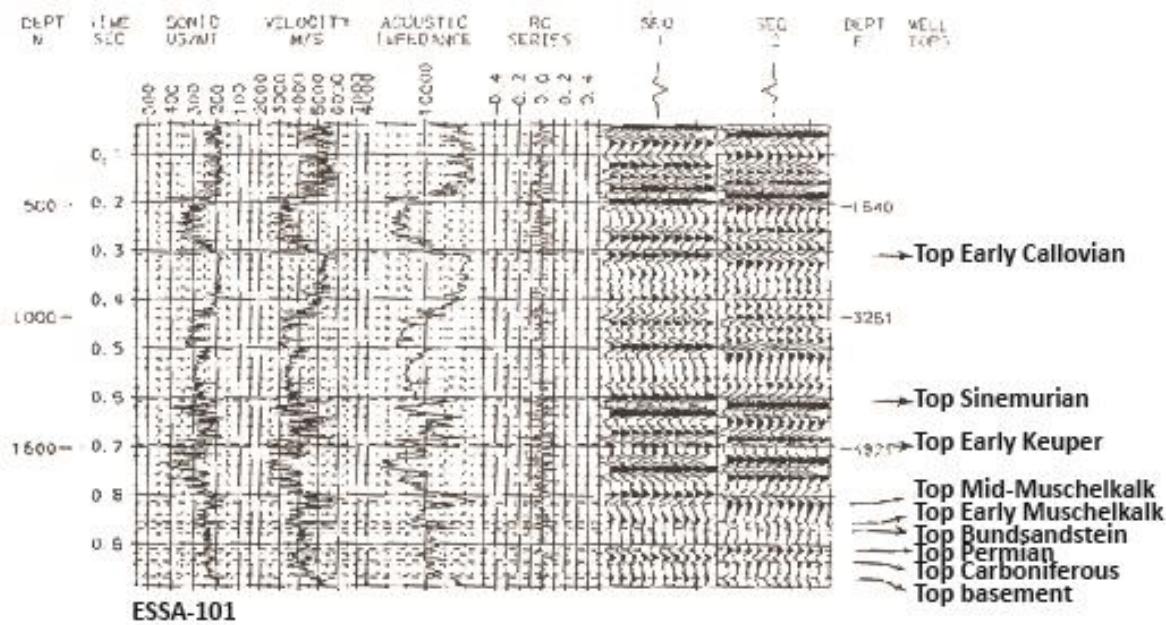


Figure S2. Seismograms used for the interpretation of seismic data and depth conversion in the Central Jura area.
