# Synthesis of $L_2Ni(OR^F)_2$ ( $R^F = C(CF_3)_3$ ) complexes and their reactivity in ethylene oligomerization.

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## **1.** Experimental procedures and NMRs

#### Reagents and solvents

All the reactions were carried out in the glove box or using standard schlenck techniques under N<sub>2</sub>. The commercial compounds stored under N<sub>2</sub> or Ar were used directly without any further purification, while the non-stored under inert atmosphere, they were degassed before use. All solvents, except o-DFB, were taken from MBSPS-800 solvent purification system, then they were degassed and dried using molecular sieves. *o*-DFB was pre-dried over CaH<sub>2</sub> and then filtered and stored on molecular sieve.

#### NMR

<sup>1</sup>H, <sup>13</sup>C, <sup>19</sup>F and <sup>31</sup>P NMR spectra were recorded on Bruker Avance 300 and 400 MHz spectrometers. <sup>1</sup>H and <sup>13</sup>C chemical shifts reported are referenced internally to used solvent while <sup>19</sup>F and <sup>31</sup>P chemical shifts are referenced to an external standard of trichlorofluoromethane and phosphoric acid respectively.

#### Elemental analysis (C, H, N)

Elemental analysis of **4**, **5**, **9** and **10** powders were carried out by combustion analysis using vario MICRO cube apparatus from Elementar.

#### UV-vis

UV-Vis analyses of **1**, **4**, **5**, **9** and **10**, solubilized in *ortho*-difluorobenzene, were carried out on a V-630 UV-vis spectrometer (Jacso) Kontron.

#### XRD analysis

X-ray intensity data of compounds **1**, **3**, **4**, **5**, **7**, **8**, **9**, **10** and **dcpmS** were collected at 193 K on a Bruker D8 VENTURE Photon III-C14 diffractometer and using graphite mono-chromated Mo K $\alpha$ radiation ( $\lambda = 0.71073$  Å) for **1**, **3**, **4**, **5**, **9** and **dcpmS** and Cu K $\alpha$  radiation ( $\lambda = 1.54178$  Å) for **7** and **10** and on a Bruker kappa APEX II Quazar diffractometer equipped with a 30W air-cooled microfocus source using Mo K $\alpha$  radiation (**8**). The semi-empirical absorption corrections were employed [1]. Crystallographic data and refinement details are given in **2**. The structures were solved using an intrinsic phasing method [2], and refined by full matrix least squares procedures on F<sup>2</sup>[3]. All non-H atoms were refined with anisotropic displacement parameters. Hydrogen atoms were refined isotropically at calculated positions using a riding model with their isotropic displacement parameters constrained to be equal to 1.5 times the equivalent isotropic displacement parameters of their pivot atoms for terminal sp3 carbon and 1.2 times for all other carbon atoms.

In most of these structures (**3**, **4**, **5**, **7**, **9** and **10**), parts of molecules were disordered. Several restraints (SAME, SADI, SIMU, DELU, ISOR) were applied to refine some moieties of the molecules and to avoid the collapse of the structures during the least-squares refinement by the large anisotropic displacement parameters. H atoms on O (**7** and **8**) were located by difference Fourier map and were refined using the restraints SADI (**7**) or DFIX (**8**).

#### GC & GC-MS

GC analyses were performed with an Agilent 6850 series II device equipped with an autosampler and fitted with PONA columns.

GC-MS analyses were conducted with an Agilent 6890 N apparatus equipped with a PONA and an Agilent 5975B inert XL EI/CI MSD mass spectrometer.

#### Syntheses

#### Synthesis of (DME)<sub>2</sub>Na<sub>2</sub>Ni[OC(CF<sub>3</sub>)<sub>3</sub>]<sub>4</sub> 1:



On a suspension of  $(DME)NiBr_2$  (500mg, 1.62mmol, 1eq.) in DCM (10mL), a solution of  $(THF)_{0.75}NaOC(CF_3)_3$  (1.07g, 3.43mmol, 2.1eq.) in DCM (10mL) is added dropwise. It slowly turned from colorless to blue over 3h at RT. White (NaBr) and yellow (NiBr<sub>2</sub>) solids precipitated. Solvent is removed under reduced pressure to give a blue solid. This solid is extracted with pentane until the solution is clear. The obtained deep blue solution is stored 4h at 5°C. After apparition of first crystals, the mixture is put at -35°C overnight to give large blue crystals as needles. These latter are washed with pentane (3\*5mL) at -40°C. Solvent is finally removed under reduced pressure. The product is obtained as a deep blue crystalline solid (730mg, 0.60mmol, 37%).

Synthesis of  $(Cy_3PO)_2Ni[OC(CF_3)_3]_2$  4:



On a solution of  $[(DME)Na(\mu-OC(CF_3)_3)_2]_2Ni$  (300mg, 0.24mmol, 1eq.) in *o*-DFB (3mL), a solution of Cy<sub>3</sub>PO (200mg, 0.67mmol, 2.8eq.) in *o*-DFB (3mL) is added dropwise. No precipitate or colorshift is observed so the solution stayed deep blue. The solvent is removed under reduced pressure and the obtained blue solid is washed with pentane (3\*5mL, use of ultrasonic bath). This solid is dissolved in a mixture of pentane/*o*-DFB (3/1 ratio). The solution is first put at 5°C over 4h until some blue crystals started to grow. To increase the crystallization rate, the schlenk is put at -35°C over 16h. After filtration, the crystals are washed with pentane (3\*5mL). Solvent is finally removed under reduced pressure. The product is obtained as a deep blue crystalline solid (247mg, 0.22 mmol, 92%).

Bis(dicyclohexylphosphino)methane (500mg, 1.22mmol, 1eq.) was dissolved in toluene (20mL). This solution was then added on elemental sulfur S<sub>8</sub> (78.5mg, 0.31mmol, 0.25eq.) to give a suspension. The mixture was allowed to react at 90°C for 24h. The obtained colorless solution was then filtered through silica and toluene was removed under reduced pressure to give a white powder (570mg, 1.21mmol, 99%).

On a solution of  $[(DME)Na(\mu-OC(CF_3)_3)_2]_2Ni$  (100mg, 0.081mmol, 1eq.) in *o*-DFB (3mL), a solution of dcpmS (38.6mg, 0.081mmol, 1eq.) in *o*-DFB (3mL) is added dropwise. No clear color change was

observed (blue). The solvent is removed under reduced pressure and the obtained blue solid is washed with pentane (3\*5mL). This solid is dissolved in a mixture of pentane/o-DFB (3/1 ratio). The solution is put at -30°C over 16h. A large amount of blue crystals is observed. They are washed with pentane (3\*5mL). Solvent is finally removed under reduced pressure. The product is obtained as a blue crystalline solid (71mg, 0.071mmol, 88%).

On a solution of  $[(DME)Na(\mu-OC(CF_3)_3)_2]_2Ni$  (100mg, 0.081mmol, 1eq.) in *o*-DFB (3mL), a solution of dcpp in *o*-DFB (170µL, 0.48mol.L<sup>-1</sup>, 0.081mmol, 1eq.) is added dropwise. A colorshift from deep blue to deep violet is immediately observed. Solvent is removed and a clear purple solution is obtained. Pentane (1mL) is added and gave a suspension. *o*-DFB is then added until full solubilization of solids.

The obtained violet solution is put at -35°C for 16h. Orange crystals grew up (compound **7**) while the solution was between violet and orange. The solution was allowed to warm up to RT which solubilized back all crystals. Letting this solution at RT over 16 more hours gave new orange crystals (compound **8**). These crystals were insoluble in all tested solvents.

Synthesis of (dppf)Ni[OC(CF<sub>3</sub>)<sub>3</sub>]<sub>2</sub> 9:



On a solution of  $[(DME)Na(\mu-OC(CF_3)_3)_2]_2Ni$  (500mg, 0.41mmol, 1eq.) in *o*-DFB (4mL), a solution of dppf (240mg, 0.43mmol, 1.1eq.) in *o*-DFB (4mL) is added dropwise. A deep brown orange solution is obtained that was left to react 2h at RT (dissolution time of the phosphine). Solvent is removed under reduced pressure. The light brown solid is washed with hot HMDSO (40°C, 5\*8mL). The obtained solid is solubilized in Et<sub>2</sub>O (5mL) and filtrated (remove excess of dppf). Solvent is removed under reduced pressure to give a light brown solid (370mg, 0.34mmol, 83%).

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On a solution of [(DME)Na(µ-OC(CF<sub>3</sub>)<sub>3</sub>)<sub>2</sub>]<sub>2</sub>Ni (1.00g, 0.81mmol, 1eq.) in *o*-DFB (3mL), a solution of 6 6'-

dimethyl-2 2'-bipyridine (165mg, 0.90mmol, 1.1eq.) in *o*-DFB (10mL) is added dropwise. A color change from deep blue to pale orange is observed. An orange/red crystalline precipitation can occur. Solvent is removed under reduced pressure until there is 0.5mL left. Pentane is added (5mL) until the liquid phase is colorless. The mixture is filtrated. This operation is repeated 4 times. One last washing with pentane (5mL) only is done and the obtained red/orange crystalline solid is dried under dynamic vacuum. The product is obtained as an orange crystalline solid (564mg, 0.79mmol, 98%).

## 4. Catalytic tests

Studies were performed in a 6-parallel semi-batch autoclaves equipment (Figure S19). The reactors were placed under an inert atmosphere of nitrogen before the *o*-DFB (or cyclohexane), the complex and  $Al(OR^F)_3$  (or  $AlEt_3$ ) were added. The total volume of solutions introduced was 20mL. The ethylene pressure was immediately increased to 20 bar and the temperature stayed at 25°C. The mechanical stirring was then set to 2000 rpm and the ethylene uptake was measured. The test was stopped after 1h or after 15 to 17g of ethylene was consumed, whichever occurred first. After quenching with (2-ethyl-hexyl)amine, the autoclave was depressurized. The liquid phase was collected (by pipette after the autoclave was opened) and weighed. After quenching with a 10%  $H_2SO_4$  solution in water (1 mL), the organic layer was analyzed by GC analyses (performed with an Agilent 6850 series II device equipped with an autosampler and fitted with PONA columns).

#### 5. $C_2H_4/C_2D_4$ experiments

#### Preparation of $C_2H_4/C_2D_4$ mixture

Thanks to the set-up described on Figure S21, the mixture of  $C_2H_4/C_2D_4$  (1/1) is created. An bottle of pure  $C_2D_4$  is taken for that experiment. The pressure is controlled out of this bottle and then, ethylene ( $C_2H_4$ ) is slowly added until the pressure is doubled compared to the initial measured pressure. The mixture is then checked by <sup>1</sup>H and <sup>2</sup>D NMR, using a mixture of a 1/1 amount of toluene and toluene- $d_8$  in  $C_6D_6$ .





#### Preparation of the catalytic solution

First of all, three schlenk tubes are prepared. In a 10mL schlenk is added a solution of complex 7 (11mg, 15 $\mu$ mol, 1 eq.) in *o*-DFB (2mL). In another 10mL schlenk, is added a 0.5mL solution of AlEt<sub>3</sub> in fluorobenzene (0.121M, 61 $\mu$ mol, 2eq.). Finally, a solution of R<sup>F</sup>OH (26 $\mu$ L, 186mmol, 3.1eq.) in *o*-DFB (5.5mL).

The AlEt<sub>3</sub> solution is cooled down to  $-30^{\circ}$ C and the solution of **10** at  $-10^{\circ}$ C. At first, the R<sup>F</sup>OH solution is added on the AlEt<sub>3</sub> solution to give a colorless solution. This mixture is let to react not more than 1min. Half of the obtained solution (3mL) is then added on the solution of **10** at  $-10^{\circ}$ C to give a pale orange solution. 0.5mL from this last solution was then added in a pressurized NMR tube and kept at  $-10^{\circ}$ C until addition of ethylene.

#### Analyses

 $1^{st}$  tests were made with  $C_2D_4$  (2.5b, RT) to determine the reaction time. The consumption of ethylene was followed by <sup>2</sup>D NMR (Figure S22). After 5 min, all ethylene is consumed. And only butenes are observed. The GC-MS analysis was then done directly after ethylene addition.



Figure S22 –  $^{2}$ D NMR of butenes obtained after catalysis under C<sub>2</sub>D<sub>4</sub>.

After addition of the 1/1 mixture of ethylenes (2.5b, 0°C), no color shift is detected. The gas phase is taken with a gas syringe and directly inserted in the GC-MS apparatus. Typical GC is shown on Figure S23. Typical MS spectrum of 1-butene is shown in the paper.
