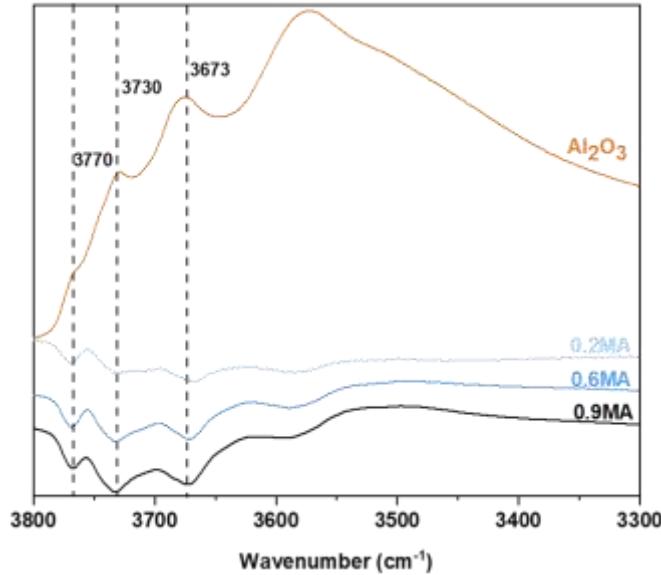

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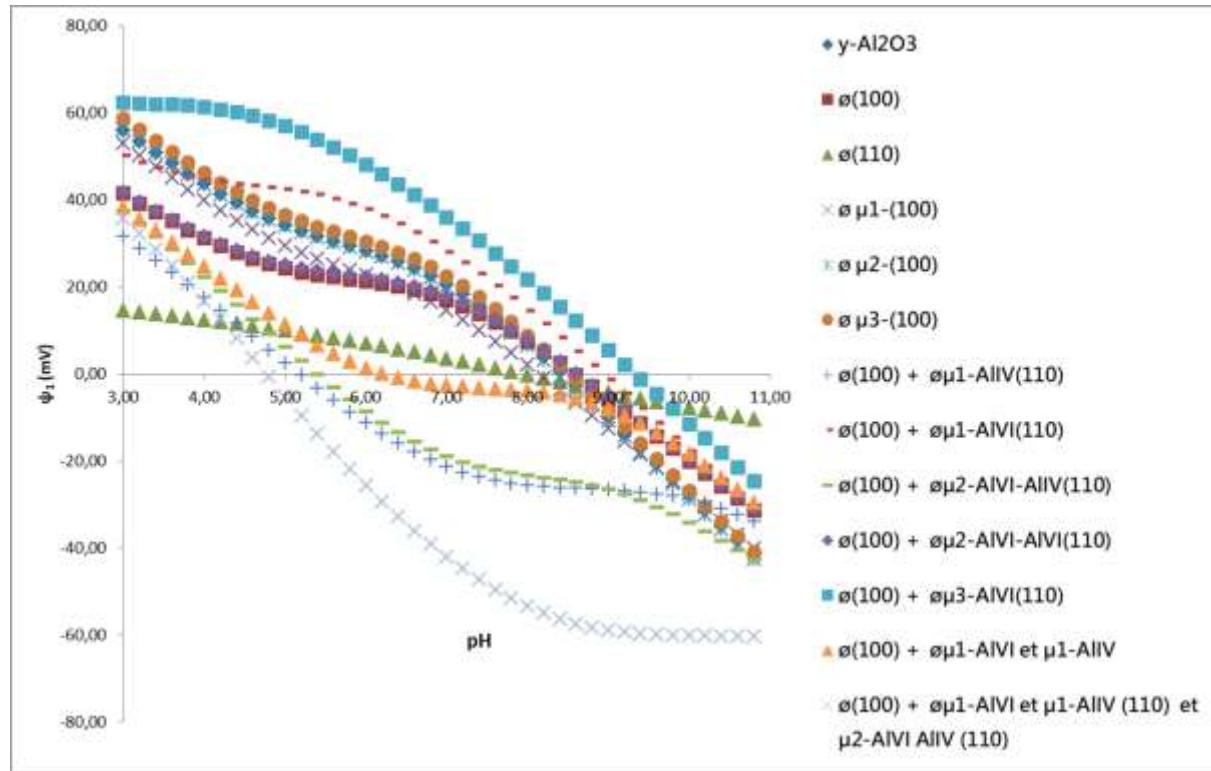

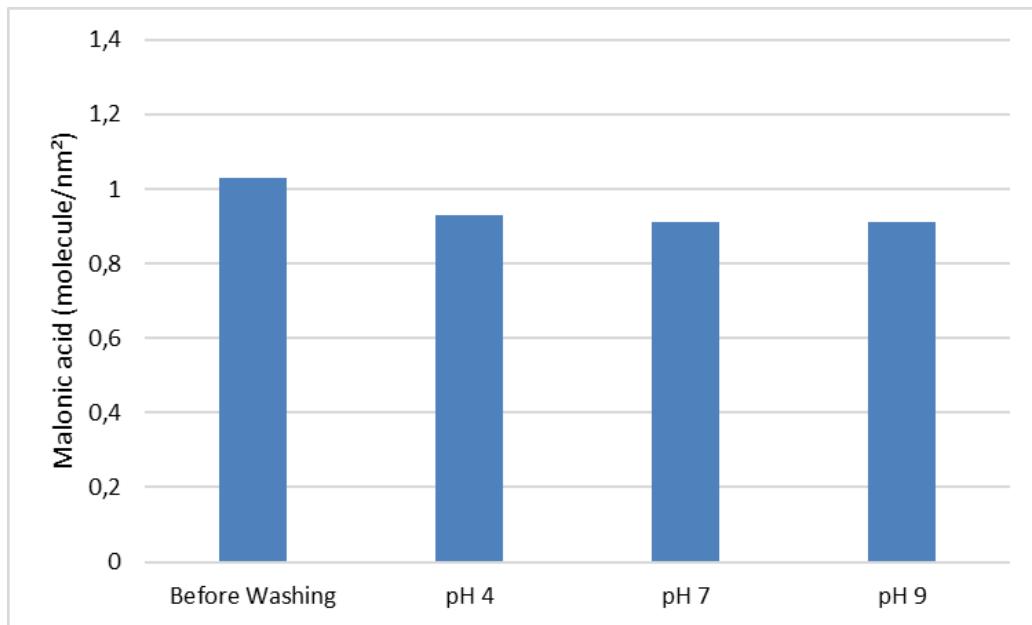
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22 **Figure S2:** PHREEQC simulations of the Ψ_1 evolution as a function of pH for different scenarios after surface sites removal of
