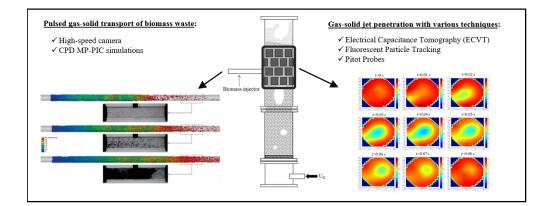
#### Abstract

The processing of biomass and biomass wastes towards renewable energy and green fuels plays an important role for the decarbonisation of global economy and mitigation of climate change. The injection of solid fuels into fluidized bed reactors for thermochemical conversion is challenging due to the inherent complexity of the multiphase system, related to the fast gassolid transport and jet interaction with bed bubbles. Ultimately, solid feeding impacts on process reliability, conversion efficiency and design robustness. In this study, the gas-solid transport and pneumatic injection in gas-solid systems was investigated. A pressurized air feeder was used to inject a batch of sawdust powders into fixed and fluidised beds at lab scale. First, the horizontal feeder was characterised as a function of the operating parameters (feeder pressure, secondary gas velocity, initial biomass content), which showed an impact on the solids flux and flow concentration. Then, these parameters were used to define a transport regime operation map for the injection line. The experimental results were used to evaluate the CPFD approach MP-PIC (Multiphase Particle in Cell) with the software Barracuda<sup>TM</sup>. The gassolid transport simulations under different feeder operating conditions showed a fair agreement with the experimental results, in terms of solids flux and flow concentration. Finally, different tracking techniques (fluorescent particle tracking, pitot tubes, and electric capacitance tomography, ECVT) were used and compared to assess the penetration and dispersion of the biomass into fixed and fluidized beds. The jet propagation was captured with transient/3D images with the ECVT, and the biomass concentration across the jet length was quantified with the fluorescent particle tracking technique. Similar jet penetration lengths were obtained with the different techniques, and it was generally more under higher solids flux from the injector. Ultimately, the pros and cons of each tracking technique were highlighted.

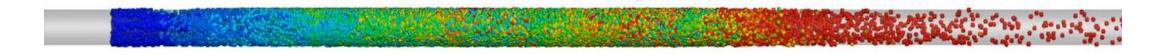

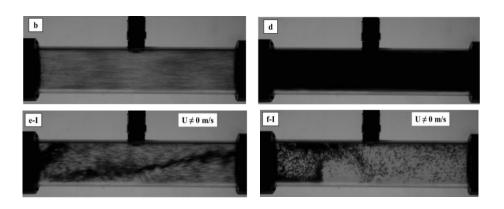




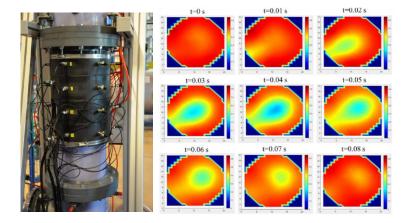

## **RESEARCH MOTIVATION**

Waste biomass as a renewable feedstock for thermochemical processes (pyrolysis, gazification, combustion...)

Challenge of feeding waste biomass into fluidized bed reactors<sup>1</sup>:

• Pneumatic injection is interesting for an efficient <u>fuel penetration</u> and <u>mixing</u>

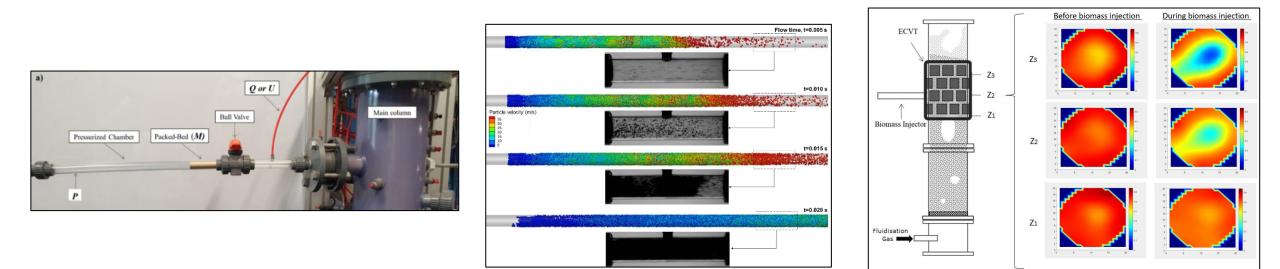






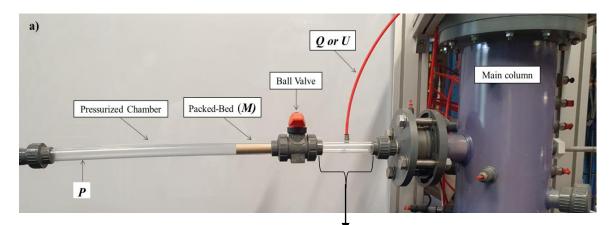

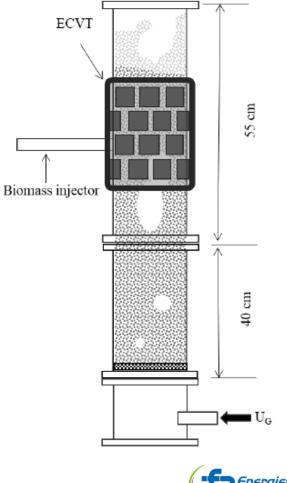
### GAS-SOLID JET PENETRATION IN FLUIDIZED BEDS<sup>4</sup>

Biomass penetration in catalyst bed was measured with:

- Electrical Capacitance Volume Tomography (ECVT)
- Fluorescent particle tracking

• Pitot probes

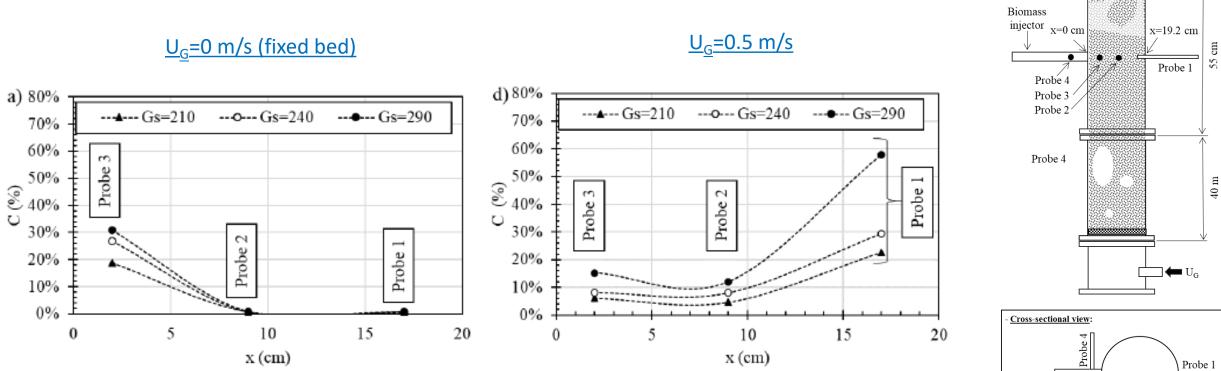




### FLUORESCENT PARTICLE TRACKING<sup>4</sup>

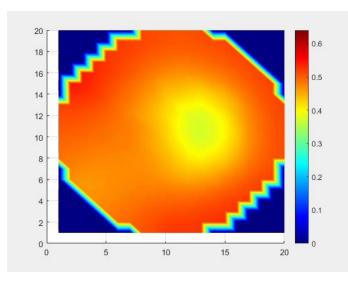

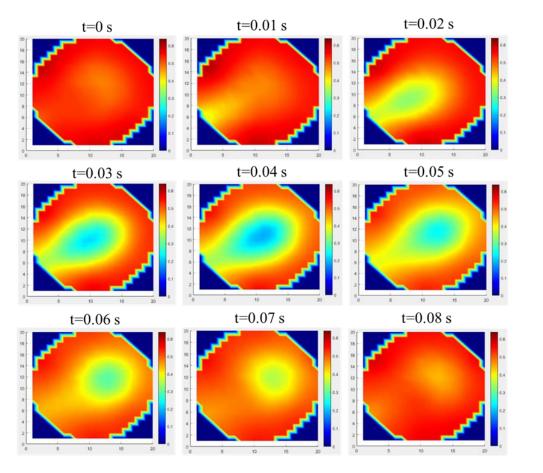
### ECVT PROFILES<sup>4</sup>

• The technique provides voidage contours.

- Post-treatment and challenge when bubbles pass through the multiphase jet.
- The concentration of biomass along the jet is not detectable.

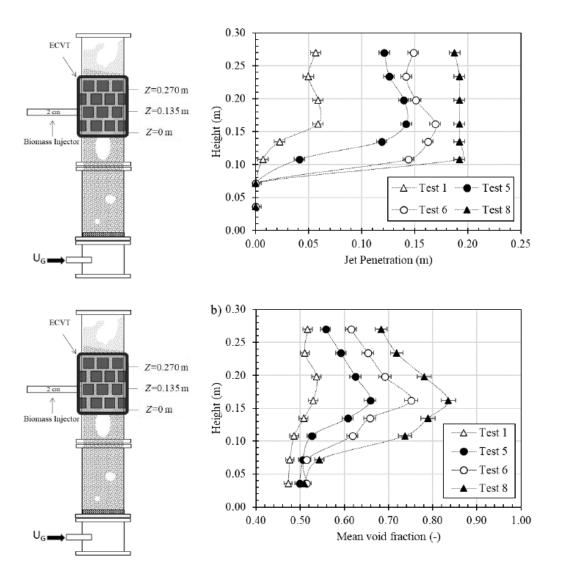


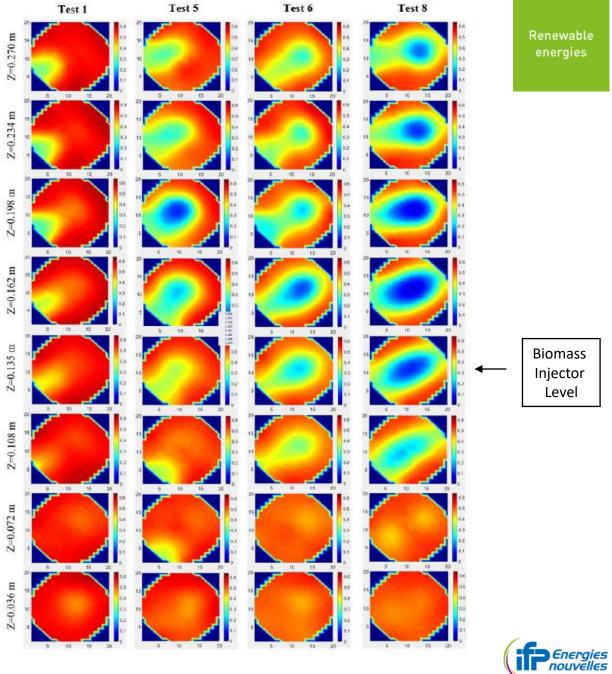




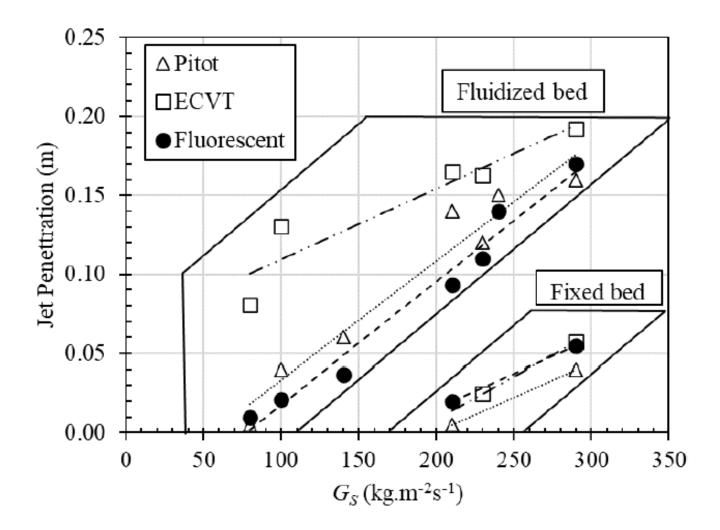








### COMPARISON OF TECHNIQUES<sup>4</sup>







#### The way the experimental data is analyzed needs to be considered for modeling.

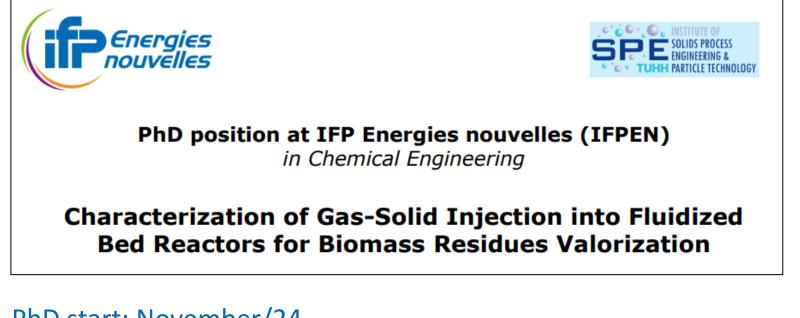
- O Hydrodynamics of a pressurized feeder for biomass injection into gas-solid units was characterized experimentally.
- MP-PIC model was tuned and compared with selected experiments to find the most adapted parameters.
- Three experimental techniques were employed to characterize the biomass penetration in the bed.
- Fluorescent particle tracking provided information on dispersion of biomass along the jet while ECVT and pitot depicted mostly the jet length.
